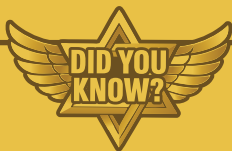

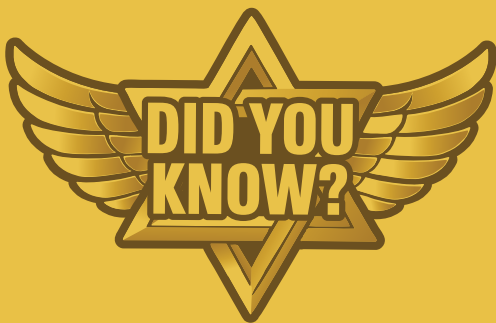

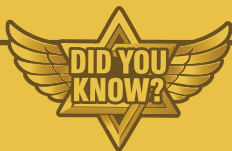
The command cord is a symbol awarded to graduates of command and instruction courses, and indicates that the soldier is qualified to lead and command. The cord, worn on the shoulder, represents responsibility, initiative and professionalism, and is a sign that a young commander stands not only at the head of a unit, but also as a personal example. The cord reflects the essence of the IDF's military culture – the expectation that every soldier will aspire to command and lead from a sense of mission. There are over 25 types of cords in the IDF, such as gray for the education system, blue-red for military police, and blue-white for NCOs responsible for discipline.
